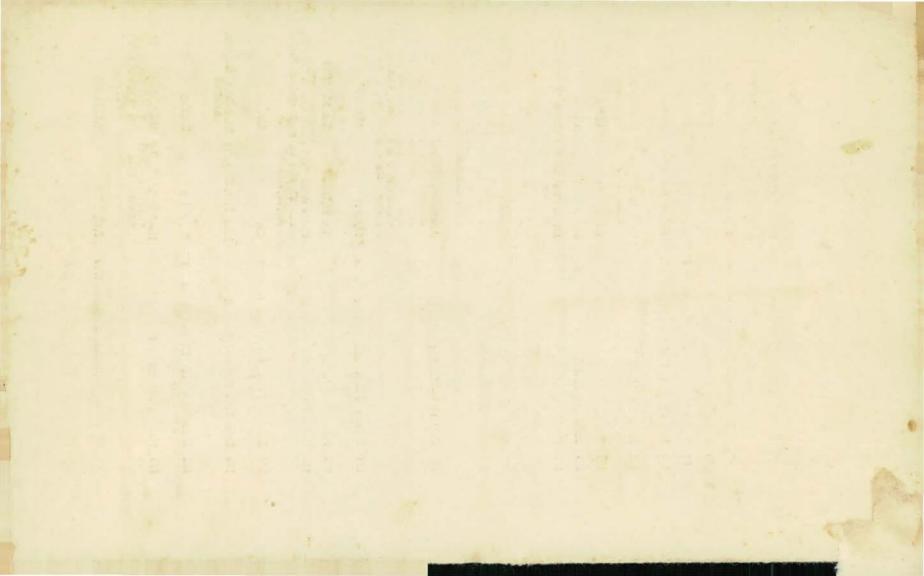


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Certificate of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India

This compilation containing the Finance Accounts of the Government of Orissa for the year 1973-74 presents the accounts of the receipts and outgoings of the Government for the year, together with the financial results disclosed by the revenue and capital accounts, the accounts of the public debt and the liabilities and assets as worked out from the balances recorded in the accounts. The appropriation Accounts of the Government for the year for Grants and Charged Appropriations, presented separately, supplement this compilation.

These accounts have been prepared and examined under my direction in accordance with the requirements of Articles 149 and 151 of the Constitution of India and the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. Subject to the observations in this compilation and to those in my Report on the accounts of the Government of Orissa for the year 1973-74, the accounts now presented are correct statements of the receipts and outgoings of the Government of Orissa for the year 1973-74.

INTRODUCTORY

The accounts of the Government of Orissa are kept in three parts-

Part I-Consolidated Fund

Part II-Contingency Fund

Part III-Public Account

In Part I, there are three main divisions, namely :-

- (1) Revenue;
- (2) Capital, and
- (3) Debt (comprising Public Debt, Loans and Advances and Inter-State Settlements).
- The first division deals with the proceeds of taxation and other receipts classed as revenue and the expenditure therefrom, the net result of which represents the revenue surplus or deficit for the year.
- The second division deals with expenditure, met usually from borrowed funds with the object either of increasing concrete assets of a material character or of reducing recurring liabilities such as those for future peasions, by payment of capitalised value. It also includes receipts of a capital nature intended to be applied as set off against capital expenditure.
- The third division comprises loans raised by Government, loans of a purely temporary nature classed as "Floating Debt" (such as Treasury Bills and Ways and Means Advances), as well as other loans classed as "Permanent Debt" and "Loans and Advances made by Government" together with repayments of the former and recoveries of the latter. It also includes inter-State Settlement.

In Part II of the accounts are recorded the transactions connected with Contingency Fund set up by the Government of Orissa, uder Article 267 (2) of the Constitution of India.

In Part III of the accounts, there are two main divisions, namely :-

- (1) Debt (other than those included in Part I) and deposits; and
- (2) Remittances
- The first division comprises receipts and payments, other than those falling under Debt heads pertaining to Part I, in respect of which Government incurs a liability to repay the moneys received or has a claim to recover the amounts paid together with repayments of the former and recoveries of the latter.

The second division embraces all merely adjusting heads under which appear remittances of cash between treasuries and transfers between different accounting circles. The initial debits or credits to the heads in this division are adjusted eventually by corresponding receipts or payments either within the same circle of account or another account circle.

2. Sections and Heads of Accounts—Within each of the divisions mentioned above, the transactions are grouped into sections which are further subdivided into major heads of account. The sections are distinguished by letters of alphabet, a single letter denoting the revenue portion and a double letter denoting the capital portion of a particular category of transactions, e. g., section A denotes the revenue (and expenditure) grouped as "Collection of Taxes, Duties and other principal heads of Revenue" and Section AA denotes the capital expenditure on works connected therewith.

The major heads in the Revenue and Capital divisions are numbered serially, Roman numerals being employed on the receipt side and International ones on the disbursement side. No numbering is adopted for the Contingency Fund and for Debt, Deposit and Remittance heads, though these are also arranged in sections.

The major heads are sub-divided into minor heads and the minor heads into sub-heads and detailed heads. Under each of these heads, the expenditure is shown distributed between charged and voted. The major, minor and sub-heads prescribed for the classification of expenditure in the general accounts are not necessarily identical with the grants, sub-heads and other units of allot ments which are adopted by the Finance Department for Demands for Grants but in general a certain degree of correlation is maintained between the Demands for Grants and the Finance Accounts.

3. System of Accounts —The transactions included in these accounts represent mainly the actual cash receipts and disbursements during the financial year ending the 31st March 1974 as distinguished from the amounts due to or from Government during the same period. The cash basis system is, however, not entirely suitable for recording the transactions and for presenting the true state of affairs of Government commercial undertakings run on commercial principles. The detailed accounts of this class of undertakings are, therefore, maintained outside the regular accounts in commercial form and are subject to test check by the Indian Audit and Accounts Department.

The figures of actuals shown in these accounts are net after taking into account the recoveries, although the Demands presented to the State Legislature and the Appropriation Accounts are for gross expenditure and exclude all credits and recoveries which are otherwise taken as reduction of expenditure.

Explanatory Notes

1. Capital Outlay on Industrial and Economic Development:—The details of the Government investments in (i) statutory corporations, (ii) Government companies, (iii) joint stock companies and (iv) Co-operative institutions are given in statement no. 14.

Fourteen companies in which the Government had invested Rs. 25:16 lakhs are under liquidation. Eleven other companies in which Government had invested Rs. 17:66 lakhs have been liquidated. Some co-operative societies are under liquidation; complete information about the realisation or the write off of Government investment in those companies/societies is awaited (November 1974).

In 1973-74 the Government invested Rs. 3'89 crores in shares of statutory corporation (Rs. 0'01 crore), Government companies (Rs. 2'34 crores), joint stock companies (Rs. 0'18 crore) and Co-operative institution (Rs. 1'36 crores). In addition Rs. 0'40 crore were invested in debentures of the Orissa Co-operative Land Development Bank.

According to the information furnished by the Government the total investment of Government in the share capital and debenture of different concerns at the end of 1971-72, 1972-73 and 1973-74 were Rs. 45'40 crores, Rs. 50'10 cfores and Rs. 54'39 crores respectively. The dividend and interest received therefrom was Rs. 11'41 lakhs (0'25 per cent), Rs. 10'06 lakhs (0'20 per cent) and Rs. 11'17 lakhs (0'20 per cent) respectively. Further details are given in Appendix I.

- 2. Capital Outlay on Multipurpose River Schemes:—Of the multipurpose river schemes, the Hirakud Dam Project (Stages I and II) has been completed. The capital invested thereon up to 1973-74 (excluding indirect charges) was Rs. 69.50 crores. The loss on its working during the year was Rs. 2.99 crores after providing the interest charges (Rs. 2.82 crores) on the capital outlay. The detailed account showing the financial results of these projects and other irrigation works is given in statement no. 3 (i).
- 3. Capital Outlay on Electricity Schemes:—With the formation of the State Electricity Board from the 1st March 1961, all completed transmission and distribution systems and generation assets of the Hirakud system and the Talcher thermal scheme have been transferred to the State Electricity Board. The allocation of Capital Outlay between the Orissa Electricity Board and the Government has not been finalised. The capital expenditure of Rs. 65'50 crores was transferred to the Board in 1964-65 (Rs. 16'72 crores), 1966-67 (Rs. 0'73 crore), 1969-70 (Rs. 17'24 crores) and 1970-71 (Rs. 30'81 crores) and has been treated as loan.
- 4. The *pro forma* accounts for 1973-74/1973 of departmentally managed undertakings, the expenditure on which is shown in the table at page 15 have not yet been prepared (November 1974). The preparation of *pro forma* accounts of some of the departmental undertakings has been delayed by two years to eleven years.

Explanatory Notes

- 1.94—Capital Outlay on Improvement of Public Health—Grants for municipal water supply and drainage schemes—According to the orders of Government, two thirds of the expenditure on urban water-supply and drainage schemes or local bodies are grants to be temporarily capitalised and written back to revenue (under major head "30—Public Health") in twelve years beginning from 1960-61. The remaining one-third is to be treated as loan to the local bodies. Out of Rs. 827:08 lakhs temporarily capitalised up to 1973-74 Rs. 239:59 lakhs have been written back to Revenue and Rs. 35.52 lakhs treated as loan to local bodies.
- 2. (i) Hirakud Dam Project Stage-I—From 1948-49 up to the completion of the Project in 1959-60 interest charges on loans obtained from Government of India for the construction of the Project were paid by debit to capital. The revenue account of the project was opened from the 1st April 1960. It was decided by the Government (August 1965) that as no revenue surplus has been derived from the project and as there is also no hope of getting any revenue surplus from the project, the capitalised interest may not be written back to revenue.
- (ii) Hirakud subsidiary power house project-Stage-II—The interest charged to capital for this project represents the interest allocated to the works pertaining to Stage-II of this project before it was taken up as an independent project. The revenue account of the project was opened from April, 1964. It was decided by the Government (August 1965) that as there is no hope of getting any surplus revenue from the project, the capitalised interest may not be written back to revenue.
- 3. Delta Irrigation Scheme—The interest charged to capital represents the interest allocated to works, which now form part of Delta Irrigation Scheme undertaken when the scheme was taken up as part of the Hirakud Dam Project. The revenue account of this scheme was opened from April, 1966.
- 4. 103—Capital Outlay on Public Works—Grants to Municipalities and the notified area councils for improvement of roads—According to the orders of the Government (January 1970) the expenditure on the road development programme of the local bodies is treated as grant to be temporarily capitalised and written back to the revenue (under major head "50—Public Works") in twelve years beginning from 1960-61. Rupees 45.36 lakhs were written back to the revenue as against Rs. 82.83 lakhs capitalised up to 1973-74.
- 5. 109—Capital Outlay on other works—According to the orders of the Government (December 1965) the total capitalised expenditure of Rs. 42'06 lakhs on grants is to be written back to the revenue over a period of twelve years from 1966-67. Of this Rs. 40'00 lakhs were written back to revenue up to 1973-74.

Explanatory Notes

- 1. Financial results of the minor irrigation schemes have not been shown in this statement.
- 2. The net loss expressed as a percentage of the capital outlay to end of 1973-74 is 5'34. The irrigation projects which have been declared as commercial undertakings are mentioned at page 18 and fifteen other multipurpose major and medium irrigation projects are under execution.
- 3. Collection of water rates:—According to rules framed by the Government in November 1961 for the assessment and the realisation of the water rates, these rates are being assessed and collected by the revenue authorities, the gross collections being accounted for under major head "IX-Land Revenue". The question of prescribing a procedure for transferring the net collection to the irrigation major heads and allocation of the revenue collected to the individual schemes opened to service was taken up with the Government in 1968. The final decision of Government is awaited.
- 4. Non-assessment of betterment levv and water charges:—Betterment charges have not been levied on lands irrigated by the canals of the irrigation schemes as no legislation for its levy has yet been enacted.
- 5. Productive and unproductive works:—The Works in the irrigation Department are classified as "productive" and "un-productive" according as the net revenue (gross revenue less working expenses) derived from each work on the expiry of ten years from the closure of construction estimate covers or does not cover the prescribed annual interest charges on the capital invested.

The productivity test involves certain pro forma adjustments which do not appear in the regular Government account. If a work classed as "Productive" fails to yield the prescribed return for three successive years it is classed as "Unproductive" class. Similarily if a work classified as unproductive yields for three successive years the prescribed return it is transferred to "Productive" class. The prescribed rate is 4 per cent on Power and 3 per cent on Irrigation for Hirakud Dam Project Stage I, 4 per cent for Orissa Canal Project and Rushikulya System, 4.5 per cent for Salandi Irrigation Project, Dhanai Irrigation Project, Salki Irrigation Project, Darjang Irrigation Project and Budhabudhiani Irrigation Project, and 3.75 per cent for Delta Irrigation Scheme.

No separate rates have been fixed for Hirakud Dam Project Stage II, Bahuda Irrigation Scheme, Hiradarbati Irrigation Schemes and Salia Irrigation Scheme.

Stages I and II of Hirakud Dam Project have been classified as "productive" from 1966-67. The other major and medium Irrigation Schemes have been classed as "Unproductive".

3(ii) FINANCIAL RESULTS OF ELECTRICITY SCHEMES

1. Machhkund Hydro-Electric (Joint) Scheme:—The Government had undertaken the Machkund Hydro-Electric (joint) scheme in 1944 jointly with the Government of Andhra Pradesh with equal rights. Subsequently it was decided that the Government of Orissa should transfer 20 per cent of its rights to the Government of Andhra Pradesh for 99 years in lieu of which the latter should pay compensation to the former according to the terms and conditions agreed upon between the two Governments. During the construction period Orissa and Andhra are to bear 30 per cent and 70 per cent respectively of the capital expenditure. The capital invested by the Government of Orissa to end of 1958-59 was Rs. 462'64 lakhs. The debits raised by the Government of Andhra Pradesh for Rs. 60° lakhs representing Orissa share (30 per cent) of the capital expenditure during 1959-60 to 1973-74 have not been accepted by the Government of Orissa.

With the formation of the Orissa State Electricity Board from March 1961 all the completed transmission and distribution systems and generating assets of Hirakud system and Talcher Thermal Scheme have been transferred to the Board. The Government has retained under it the Machkund Hydro Electric (joint) Scheme.

The actual receipts from sale of power and miscellaneous revenue of Machkund Hydro-Electric (joint) Scheme were Rs. 183'12 lakhs in 1973-74 against working expenses of Rs. 102'73 lakhs (exclusive of interest charges on capital provided by the Government). The gross receipts from the scheme and the working expenses exclusive of interest on capital to end of 1973-74 were Rs. 915'21 lakhs; and Rs. 403'67 lakhs respectively.

2. Balimela Dam and Power Project:—The project was taken up by the Government in 1961-62 jointly with the Government of Andhra Pradesh at an estimated cost of Rs. 24'00 crores. While the expenditure on the Dam was to be shared equally by the two Governments; fifty pr cent of water of the reservoir was to be utilised by the power project in the Orissa side. Since the entire project is under execution by the Government of Orissa the expenditure in excess of the original estimate is being borne in full by Government, pending final agreement with the Government of Andhra Pradesh. The total expenditure on the project at the end of 1973-74 was Rs. 60'49 crores (Balimela Dam Rs. 29'35 crores and Balimela Power Project Rs. 31'14 crores).

Two out of the three units of the power projects were commissioned during 1973-74. The power generated was treated as sales to Orissa State Electricity Board which in turn transferred the entire power to Andhra grid since there was delay in completion of transmission lines connecting the powerhouse with the Talcher-Hirakud grid.

The actual receipt on sale of power (to Orissa State Electricity Board) was Rs. 1,18:00 lakhs in 1973-74 against working expense of Rs. 3:32 lakhs and interest charges of Rs. 173:15 lakhs on capital provided by the Government.

Explanatory Notes

(1) Total Debt—The total indebtedness of the State Government increased by Rs. 62'97 crores during 1973-74 to Rs. 653'26 crores.

The total repayment of debt during the year was Rs. 54.23 crores. of that Rs. 1.07 crores were repaid to the Reserve Bank of India, the National Co-operative Development Corporation and the Life Insurance Corporation of India were charged to revenue.

(2) Permanent Debt—These are long term loans raised from the open market. During the year Government raised a loan of Rs. 6:55 crores. This bears 5 \(\frac{3}{4}\) per cent interest and is repayable at par in 1985. No loan was due for repayment during 1973-74.

The repayment of Rs. 0.19 crore represents discharge of expired loans to the extent tendered for discharge during the year.

Full particulars of outstanding loans of Rs. 80.52 crores under this head will be found in statement no. 17.

Arrangements for amortisation—In accordance with the notifications for the open market loans raised by the Government, the following provisions for amortisation of each loan are to be made annually beginning with the financial year immediately following that in which the loan was raised.

- (a) Depreciation Fund—A sum equal to $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the total nominal amount of loans raised upto 1970-71 was set apart annually up to 1971-72 to from a depreciation fund for purchasing the securities of the loans for cancellation. No such provision was made there after.
- (b) Sinking Fund—In addition to the annual contributions to the respective depreciation funds, an annual contribution is made to the sinking fund for amortisation of loans at such rates as the Government may decide from time to time.

Rupees 13,71·29 lakhs out of the total balance in the funds have been invested in securities. Of that Rs. 4,52·31 lakhs have been invested in securities of the Government of India, Rs. 5,64·78 lakhs in securities of the other States and Rs. 3,54·20 lakhs in debentures and bonds of the Orissa Cooperative Land Development Bank, Electricity Boards of Orissa and the other States and the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation.

The annexure to statement no. 19 shows further particulars of depreciation funds, contributions from the State revenues to sinking fund and investments out of accumulations in the sinking fund of the respective loans.

(3) Floating Debt—Ways and means advances of Rs. 14'42 crores were availed of by Government from the Reserve Bank of India during 1973-74 which were repaid during that yrear.

Cash credit accommodation from the State Bank of India to the extent of Rs. 4'00 crores was availed of by the Government in March, 1974; no repayment was made during the year.

(4) Loans from the Government of India—A statement of loans taken by the State Government is given in statement no. 17.

The Government have made the following amortisation arrangement for the repayment of the loans taken from the Government of India as its share out of market borrowing in 1963 (in lieu of open market loans 1975) and for industrial housing scheme.

Share out of the open market borrowings in 1963—A contribution is made to the sinking fund for amortisation of loan (repayable in 1975) at such rate as the Government may decide from time to time. No contributions were made to the sinking fund up to 1968-69. Rupees 1,16:14 lakhs were contributed from revenues to the sinking fund during 1973-74. The balance in the fund at the end of 1973-74 was Rs. 5,80:71 lakhs.

Industrial Housing Scheme—An amount equivalent to the actual recoveries made from the industrialists is transferred to a sinking fund. The balance in the fund at the end of 1973-74 was Rs. 17.20 lakhs. Of this Rs. 9.69 lakhs were invested in the securities of the Government of India.

The annexure to statement no. 19 shows further particulars of contributions from the State revenues to the sinking fund and investment out of accumulation in the sinking fund.

Rehabilitation loans—The revised terms decided by the Government of India in August 1959 for the repayment of relief and rehabilitation loans have been accepted by the State Government. Rupees 53:17 lakhs and Rs. 25:53 lakhs on account of principal and interest respectively were due for repayment upto the 31st March 1974 according to these terms and conditions. The State Government is, however, paying to the Government of India only the sums actually realised from the displaced persons.

In June 1964 the Government of India decided that the State Government should be absolved of the responsibility for sharing any portion of losses on loans granted to the displaced persons migrated from erstwhile East Pakistan prior to the 31st March 1964 (other than those granted to the

displaced persons migrated after the 31st December 1963). Rupees 4.63 lakhs so far worked out by the State Government as loss on a portion of the loan were remitted during 1973-74; such remissions to the end of 1973-74 were Rs. 30.89 lakhs.

For loans for the rehabilitation of the repatriates from Burma, according to the terms decided by the Government of India, Rs 24:11 lakhs toward principal and Rs. 18:64 lakhs towards interest were due for payment upto the 31st March 1974. The State Government however decided in May 1969, to pay only the sums realised from the Burma repatriates; no amount was repaid to Government of India during 1973-74; although Rs, 0:76 lakhs towards principal and Rs. 0:56 lakh towards interest were realised from the repatriate on this account.

Rupees 4.72 crores were received by the Government during 1973-74 as ways and means advances for Centrally sponsored schemes; of these, Rs. 4.05 crores were adjusted as grants and Rs. 0.67 crore were converted as loans during the year.

Rupees 22:09 crores were received from the Government of India as loans during 1973-74 for State Plan Schemes.

(5) Other Loans—The particulars of the outstanding loans will be found in statement no. 17.

The Government have also made amortisation arrangements for the repayment of loans taken from the Life Insurance Corporation of India for housing schemes. Rupees 7.24 lakhs were contributed from revenue to the sinking fund during 1973-74. The balance in the fund at the end of 1973-74 was Rs. 55.52 lakhs.

(6) Unfunded Debt—This comprises the provident fund balances of the Government servants.

(ii) Other obligations

In addition to the borrowings mentioned above the balances at the credit of the earmarked and the other funds as also certiain deposits, to the extent to which they have not been invested but are merged with general balance of Government also constitute the liability of the State Government. The amount of this liability at the end of 1973-74 was Rs. 72-14 crores as below; further details are given in statement nos. 16 and 19.

No law under Article 293 of the Constitution has been passed by the State Legislature laying down the limits within which the Government may give guarantees on the security of the Consolidated Fund of the State.

The Government guaranteed the payment of loans, etc., raised by various institutions and in consideration thereof they were to pay to the Government grarantee commission at rates varying from $\frac{1}{4}$ per cent to $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the outstanding guarantee. Some institutions defaulted in payment of the guarantee commission. The extent of such default, according to information furnished by the departmental officers, has been mentioned in col. 4 of the detailed statement below. It will be seen that Rs. 36·33 lakhs were outstanding from these bodies towards guarantee commission.

The Government paid Rs. 3'19 lakhs during 1973-74 in discharge of guarantee obligations for one Government Company, one Marketing Society and two industrial Co-operatives. Government have initiated action to recover the amount through proposals of liquidation and leasing out the units.

Explanatory Notes

Under an agreement with the Reserve Bank of India the State Government has to maintain with the Reserve Bank a minimum balance of Rs. 30 lakhs on all working days from 1st March 1967. The Bank informs the Government of its daily balance with the Bank at the close of each working day. If the balance falls below the agreed minimum on any day the deficiency is made good either by taking a ways and means advance from the Reserve Bank or by selling treasury bills.

The ways and means advances are granted by the Bank only upto a limit mutually agreed upon between the Bank and the Government. During 1973-74 the limits were Rs. 3.60 crores for normal and Rs. 4.40 crores for special ways and means advances. The rate of interest on both the advances is charged at one per cent below the bank rate; during 1973-74 it was five per cent.

The ways and means advances of Rs. 14'42 crores obtained from the Reserve Bank during 1973-74 were repaid during that year. The interest paid on the advances during the year was Rs. 1'24 lakhs.

If even after the maximum advance is given the cash balance is below the minimum, the deficiency is left uncovered but the bank charges interest at the bank rate on such overdrafts; during 1973-74 it was six per cent. The Government paid Rs. 0.18 lakh as interest on the overdraft for the year 1972-73.

The Treasury Bills of Rs. 105.04 crores were also rediscounted on various dates during 1973-74 to make up the deficiency in the cash balance. The minimum cash balance with the Reserve Bank of India was maintained by the State Government during 1973-74 for 301 days without obtaining advances and for 64 days by taking normal and special ways and means advances.

2. The cash balance with the Reserve Bank (minus Rs. 20,12.36 lakhs) as shown in Government account represents the balance after taking into account inter Governmental monetary settlements partaining to 1973-74 advised to the Reserve Bank upto the 25th April 1974.

Explanatory Notes

The significance of the term "Government Account" is explained in note 3 below. The other headings in the summary take into account the balances in the Government books where the Government has a liability to repay the moneys received or has a claim to recover the amount paid and also heads of account opened in the books for adjustment of remittance transactions. It must be understood that these balances cannot be regarded as complete record of the financial position of the Government of Orissa as these do not take into account the physical assets of the State such as lands, buildings, communications, etc. nor any accrued dues or outstanding liabilities which are not brought to account under the cash basis of accounting followed by the Government.

 A summary of receipts, disbursements and balances under debt, deposits and remittances and the Contingency fund is given in statement no. 16.

In a number of cases there are unreconciled differences in the closing balance as reported in statement no. 16 and that shown in the separate registers or other records maintained in the Accounts Office/departmental offices for the purpose. Steps are being taken to settle the discrepancies as soon as possible. In many cases the full details and documents required for the purpose are awaited from the department/Tressury officers some cases are detailed in Appendix-II.

The balances are communicated to the departmental officers every year for acceptance thereof. In a large number of cases such acceptances have not been received.

The following are instances where verification and acceptance of balances of large amounts have been delayed. In many cases the delay extends over several years:

3.
