CERTIFICATE OF THE COMPTROLLER AND AUDITOR-GENERAL OF INDIA

This compilation containing the Finance Accounts of the Government of West Bengal for the year 1964-65 presents the accounts of the receipts and outgoings of the Government for the year, together with the financial results disclosed by the revenue and capital accounts, the accounts of the public debt and the liabilities and assets as worked out from the balances recorded in the accounts. It supplements the accounts separately presented in the form of Appropriation Accounts for Grants and Charged Appropriations.

These Accounts which as Comptroller and Auditor-General, I am required to prepare, have been prepared and examined under my direction in accordance with the requirements of Article 149 of the Constitution of India read with paragraph 11(4) of the Government of India (Audit and Accounts) Order, 1936, as adapted under the India (Provisional Constitution) Order, 1947. It is to be noted that the Comptroller and Auditor-General's responsibility for the audit of the accounts of the Government does not at present extend in full to the audit of the accounts of revenue, but I am satisfied, on the best information available, that the accounts of revenue included in the Finance Accounts herewith presented give a correct statement of the sums brought to account. Subject to these observations and also to those contained in this compilation as well as in the Audit Report, 1966, the accounts now presented are correct statements of the receipts and outgoings of the Government of West Bengal for the year 1964-65.

INTRODUCTORY

The Accounts of the Government of West Bengal are kept in three parts :

Part I—Consolidated Fund.

Part II—Contingency Fund.

Part III—Public Account.

2. *Main Divisions* : In Part I, there are three main divisions, namely :

- (1) Revenue ;
- (2) Capital ; and
- (3) Debt (comprising Public Debt, Loans and Advances and Inter-State Settlement).

The first division deals with the proceeds of taxation and other receipts classed as revenue and the expenditure therefrom, the net result of which represents the revenue surplus or deficit for the year.

The second division deals with expenditure met usually from borrowed funds with the object either of increasing concrete assets of a material character or of reducing recurring liabilities, such as those for future pensions, by payment of the capitalised value. It also includes receipts of a capital nature intended to be applied as set off against capital expenditure.

The third division comprises loans raised by Government loans of a purely temporary nature classed as "Floating Debt" (such as Treasury Bills and Ways and Means Advances), as well as other loans classed as "Permanent Debt" and "Loans and Advances made by Government" together with repayments of the former and recoveries of the latter. It also includes Inter-State Settlements.

In Part II of the accounts are recorded the transactions connected with the Contingency Fund set up by the Government of West Bengal under Article 267(2) of the Constitution of India.

In Part III of the accounts, there are two main divisions, namely :

- (1) Debt (other than those included in Part I) and Deposits ; and
- (2) Remittances.

The first division comprises receipts and payments, other than those falling under Debt heads pertaining to Part I, in respect of which Government incurs a liability to repay the money received or has a claim to recover the amounts paid together with repayments of the former and recoveries of the latter.

The second division embraces all merely adjusting heads under which appear remittances of cash between treasuries and transfers between different accounting circles. The initial debits or credits to the heads in this division are adjusted eventually by corresponding receipts or payments either within the same circle of account or in another account circle.

3. *Sections and Heads of Accounts* : Within each of the divisions mentioned above, the transactions are grouped into sections which are further subdivided into Major Heads of Accounts. The sections are distinguished by letters of alphabet, a single letter denoting the revenue portion and a double letter denoting the capital portion of a particular category of transactions, e.g., Section A denotes the revenue (and expenditure) grouped as "Taxes, Duties and Other Principal Heads of Revenue" and Section AA denotes the capital expenditure on works connected therewith.

The Major Heads in the Revenue and Capital divisions are numbered serially, Roman numerals being employed on the receipt side and Arabic on the disbursement side. No numbering is adopted for the Contingency Fund and for Debt, Deposit and Remittance heads, though these are also arranged in sections.

The Major Heads are subdivided into Minor Heads and the Minor Heads into Sub-heads and detailed heads. Under each of these heads, the expenditure is shown distributed between Charged and Voted. The Major, Minor and Sub-heads prescribed for the classification of the expenditure in the general accounts are not necessarily identical with the Grants, Sub-heads and other units of allotments which are adopted by the Finance Department for Demands for Grants but in general a certain degree of co-relation is maintained between the Demands for Grants and the Finance Accounts.

4. *System of Accounts* : The transactions included in these accounts represent mainly the actual cash receipts and disbursements during the financial year ending 31st March, 1965, as distinguished from the amounts due to or by Government during the same period. The cash-basis system is, however, not entirely suitable for recording the transactions and for representing the true state of affairs of Government Commercial undertakings, run on commercial principles. The detailed accounts of this class of undertakings are, therefore, maintained outside the regular accounts in commercial form and are subject to a test check by the Indian Audit and Accounts Department.

The figures of actuals shown in these accounts are net, after taking into account the recoveries although the Demands presented to the Legislature and the Appropriation Accounts are for gross expenditure and exclude all credits and recoveries which are otherwise taken in reduction of expenditure.

2. Taxation changes during the year—During the year 1964-65 no new tax was levied. The rates of registration fees were, however, raised. This was estimated to yield an additional revenue of Rs. 0·27 crore.

3. Revenue Receipts—The increase of Rs. 15·43 crores in revenue receipts from Rs. 125·91 crores in 1963-64 to Rs. 141·33 crores in 1964-65 was mainly under the following heads :—

*Explanatory Notes—***Productive and unproductive works—**

Works in the Irrigation Department are classified as 'Productive' or 'Unproductive' according as whether the net revenue (Gross revenue less working expenses) derived from each work on the expiry of ten years from the date of closure of the construction estimates covers or does not cover the prescribed annual interest charges on capital invested.

The rate of interest prescribed from different years was as follows :

Project constructed before 1st April, 1919— 4 per cent.

Project constructed between 1st April, 1919 and 1st August, 1921-- 5 per cent.

Project constructed between 2nd August, 1921 and 31st, March, 1941— 6 per cent.

Project constructed between 1st April, 1941 and August, 1954--4 per cent.

In regard to all projects financed by Central Government or such of the State works for the execution of which loans may be asked for from the Central Government, the Government of India have, with effect from 17th August, 1954, fixed 4½ per cent. as the rate of productivity test. In respect of other works the Government of West Bengal fixed the rate as 6 per cent. for those taken up between the 2nd August, 1921 and 31st March, 1941 and as 4 per cent. for those taken up after the 1st April, 1941.

The productivity test involves certain *proforma* adjustments which do not appear in Government accounts. If a work classed as 'Productive' fails to yield the prescribed return for three successive years, it is transferred to the 'Unproductive' class. Similarly, if a work, classed as 'Unproductive' succeeds in yielding for three successive years the prescribed return it is transferred to the 'Productive' class

There was no productive work in the State as at the end of 1964-65.

Explanatory Notes—

(1) **Permanent Debt.**—This category covers long term loans raised in the open market to finance certain projects. During the year, a loan of Rs. 7.00 crores bearing interest at $4\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. was raised at a discount of one-fourth per cent. This loan is redeemable at par in 1976. Out of the total proceeds (Rs. 7.00 crores) of this loan, a sum of Rs. 6.50 crores was realised in cash and the balance of Rs. 0.50 crore by conversion of 4 per cent. West Bengal Loan, 1964.

Arrangements for amortisation.—The following arrangements have been made for the amortisation of loans raised in the open market. (These are in accordance with the announcements made at the time of floating the loans).

(a) *Depreciation Fund*—A sum equal to $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the total nominal amount of the loan is set apart to form a Depreciation Fund for purchasing the securities of the loans for cancellation.

(b) *Sinking Fund*—In addition to the annual contribution to the respective Depreciation Fund, an annual contribution is made to the Sinking Fund for amortisation of the loans at such rates as the Government may

The terms and conditions of repayment of 17 loans including Rehabilitation Loans (Rs. 1,22.18 lakhs) amounting to Rs. 1,45.08 lakhs sanctioned during the period from 1959-60 to 1964-65 by the Government of India have not been settled. No repayment has consequently been made in respect of these loans.

In regard to the Rehabilitation loans other than those mentioned in para 1 above, the revised terms and conditions of the repayment as recommended by the Finance Commission have not been accepted by the State Government. They pay to the Government of India whatever amount Government collect including arrears, if any, from the loanees during the year. A sum of Rs. 27.67 crores on account of principal and Rs. 13.27 crores on account of interest remained outstanding towards repayment of the loans on the 31st March, 1965, according to the original terms and conditions of repayment.

An amount of Rs. 31.68 crores was received by the State Government from the Government of India during 1964-65 as Ways and Means Advance for Plan Schemes of which a sum of Rs. 23.11 crores has been adjusted as loan and Rs. 8.57 crores as grants. The loan has been shown included in the total loan of Rs. 53.32 crores received during the year.

Explanatory Notes—

1. Under the agreement with the Reserve Bank of India, the Government of West Bengal have to maintain with the Bank a minimum balance of Rs. 25 lakhs on every Friday and not less than Rs. 20 lakhs on other days. The Bank informs the Government by telegram of their daily balance with the Bank at the close of each working day. If this balance falls on weekly settling days below the agreed minimum, the deficiency is made good either by taking a ways and means advance from the Reserve Bank or by selling Treasury Bills. The Bank allows the State Government Ways and Means Advances up to a maximum of Rs. 50 lakhs. If even after taking these advances, the State Government is not able to maintain the minimum cash balance the Bank allows the State Government overdrafts.

During the major part of April, 1964, the Cash Balance fell short of the stipulated minimum balance and Government had to take “Ways and Means Advance” of Rs. 50 lakhs from the Bank. In addition, overdrafts amounting to Rs. 8,87 lakhs were also obtained in order to cover short falls in the minimum balance ranging from Rs. 5 lakhs to Rs. 6,62 lakhs. These were, however, fully repaid during the year together with interest amounting to Rs. 1·07 lakhs. No Treasury Bills were issued during the year.

2. The balances under the head “Remittances in Transit” represent remittances between Treasuries and Currency Chests remaining unadjusted on the 31st March, 1965.

3. The investments held in the Cash Balance Investment Account were wholly in Government of India securities. The interest realised during the year on these investments amounted to Rs. 7·01 lakhs.

Explanatory Notes—

The significance of the head "Government Account" is explained in note 6 below. The other headings in this summary take into account the balances under all account heads in Government books in regard to which Government has a liability to repay the moneys received or has a claim to recover the amounts paid and also heads of account opened in the books for adjustment of Remittance transactions. It must be understood that these balances cannot be regarded as a complete record of the financial position of the Government of West Bengal as it does not take into account all the physical assets of the State, such as lands, buildings, communications, etc., nor any accrued dues or outstanding liabilities which are not brought to the account under the cash basis of accounting followed by Government.

STATEMENT No. 8—SUMMARY OF BALANCES UNDER CONSOLIDATED FUND, CONTINGENCY FUND AND PUBLIC ACCOUNT—contd.

2. Subject to the remarks in note 3 below, the balances, whether in cash or investments under each head have been duly verified and found to agree with those shown in the separate registers or other records maintained in the Accounts office for the purpose in accordance with the prescribed rules. The debits and credits during the year to the different Reserve Funds and Deposit Accounts of Grants, etc., were for amounts authorised by the relevant Acts or Rules of the Funds or Accounts, and there were no diversions for purposes other than those for which the Funds were constituted or the Grants were made.

3. A summary of receipts, disbursements and balances under Debt, Deposit and Remittance Heads and Contingency Fund is given in Statement No. 16.

In a number of cases, there are unreconciled differences in the closing balance as reported in Statement No. 16 and that shown in the separate registers or other records maintained in the Accounts Office/Departmental Office for the purpose. Steps are being taken to settle the discrepancies as soon as possible. In many cases the full details and documents required for the purpose are awaited from the Treasury Officers as detailed in the Appendix to this compilation.

The balances are communicated to the officers concerned every year for acceptance thereof. In a large number of cases such acceptances have not been received. The following are instances where the verification and acceptance of balances involving large amounts have been delayed

4. Full information regarding the different Local Funds, Deposits and Advances, etc., relating to the State of Cooch Behar, since merged with West Bengal, has not been furnished by administrative authorities. It has not, therefore, been possible to include such items in the relevant broadsheets and other registers of the Accounts Office and to review them properly. The balances under "Departmental Advances" and a portion of "Permanent Advances" continue to be shown in lump under the ordinary account heads instead of being split up into relevant departmental heads, for want of adequate details of the transactions.

5. Under the scheme embodied in the Bihar and West Bengal (Transfer of Territories) Act, 1956, certain balances under Capital heads (outside the Revenue Account) and Debt, Deposit and Remittance heads are to be transferred by the Government of Bihar to the Government of West Bengal. A portion of the amount under Debt heads was adjusted in the accounts of 1962-63. As regards other adjustments, the matter is under correspondence with the Government of Bihar.

Government Account

6. Under the system of book-keeping followed in Government Accounts, the amounts booked under revenue, capital and other transactions of Government in respect of which the balances are not carried forward from year to year in the accounts are closed to a single head called "Government Account". The balance under this head represents the cumulative result of all such transactions so that after adding thereto the balances under Debt, Deposit, Remittance heads and Contingency Fund, the closing cash balance at the end of the year may be worked out and proved. The Government Account for 1964-65 given below will show how the net amount at the end of the year has been arrived at :
