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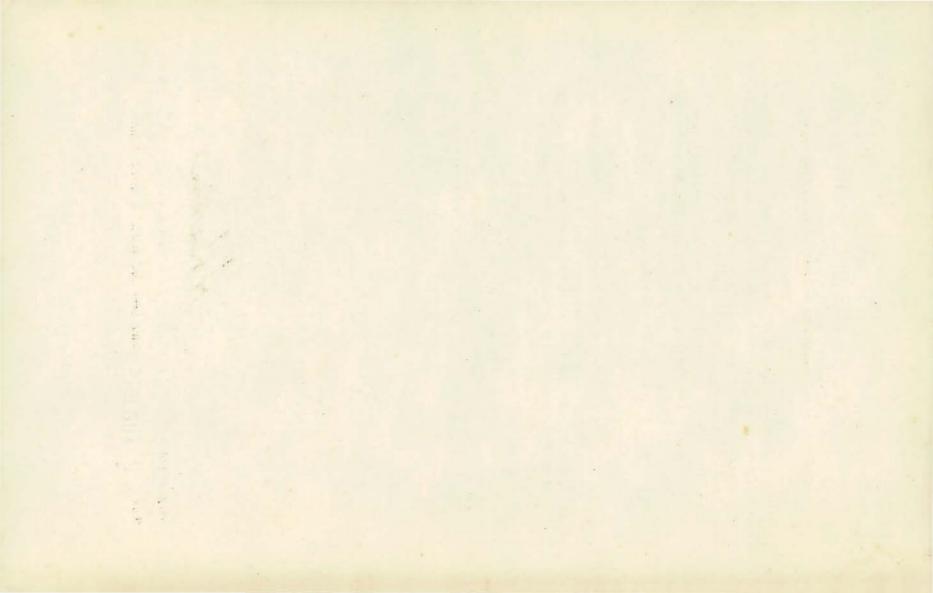
Certificate of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India

This compilation containing the Finance Accounts of the Government of Orissa for the year 1974-75 presents the accounts of the receipts and outgoings of the Government for the year, together with the financial results disclosed by the revenue and capital accounts, the accounts of the public debt and the liabilities and assets as worked out from the balances recorded in the accounts. The Appropriation Accounts of the Government for the year for Grants and Charged Appropriations, presented separately, supplement this compilation.

These accounts have been prepared and examined under my direction in accordance with the requirements of Articles 149 and 151 of the Constitution of India and the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. Subject to the observations in this compilation and to those in my Report on the accounts of the Government of Orissa for the year 1974-75, the accounts now presented are, according to my information, correct statements of the receipts and outgoings of the Government of Orissa for the year 1974-75.

INTRODUCTORY

A team of officers was constituted by Government of India in March 1969 to consider certain matters relating to accounts and budget arising out of the recommendations of the Administrative Reforms Commission. In its report on "Classification of Government Transactions in Accounts and Plan" submitted in November 1972, the team recommended extensive structural changes in the accounts. The team suggested that the expenditure heads be grouped in three sectors, namely, General Services, Social and Community Services and Economic Services and, in addition, suggested another group entitled "Grants-in-aid and Contributions". Within each such sector a major head is to represent a function while a subdivision thereof, namely, minor head, is to represent a programme. On the basis of the team's recommendations changes in the structure of accounts and classification of Government transactions have been introduced from April 1974.

2. The accounts of Government are kept in three parts :-

Part I— Consolidated Fund Part II — Contingency Fund

Part III - Public Account

In Part I, there are two main divisions, viz. :

- (1) Revenue— Consisting of sections for 'Receipt Heads (Revenue Account)', and 'Expenditure Heads (Revenue Account)';
- (2) Capital Public Debt, Loans, etc.—consisting of sections for 'Receipt Heads (Capital Account),' 'Expenditure Heads (Capital Account)' and 'Public Debt, Loans and Advances, etc.'

First Division

The first division deals with the proceeds of taxation and other receipts classed as revenue and the expenditure met therefrom, the net result of which represents the revenue surplus or deficit for the year.

Second Division

In this division, the section 'Receipt Heads (Capital Account)' deals with receipts of capital nature which can not be applied as a set-off to capital expenditure.

The section 'Expenditure Heads (Capital Account)' deals with expenditure met usually from borrowed funds with the object either of increasing concrete assets of a material and permanent character or of reducing recurring liabilities. It also includes receipts of a capital nature intended to be applied as set off against expenditure.

The section 'Public Debt, Loans and Advances, etc.' comprises loans raised and their repayments by Government such as 'Internal Debt' and 'Loans and Advances' made (and their recoveries) by Government. The Section also includes certain special types of heads for transactions relating to 'Transfers from the Consolidated Fund to the Contingency Fund' and 'Inter-State Settlement'.

In Part II of the accounts are recorded the transactions connected with the Contingency Fund set up by Government under Article 267 (2) of the Constitution of India.

In Part III of the accounts, the transactions relating to 'Debt' (other than those included in Part I), 'Deposits', 'Advances', 'Remittances' and 'Suspense' are recorded. The transactions under 'Debt', 'Deposits' and 'Advances' in this part are those in respect of which Government incurs a liability to repay the money received or has a claim to recover the amounts paid, together with the repayments of the former ('Debt' and 'Deposits') and the recoveries of the latter ('Advances'). The transactions relating to 'Remittances' and 'Suspense' in this part embrace all heads which are merely adjusting heads under which appear such transactions as remittances of cash between treasuries and currency chests, accounts between different accounting circles, etc.,. The initial debits or credits to these heads will be cleared eventually by corresponding receipts or payments either within the same circle of account or in another account circle.

3. Sectors and Heads of Accounts

Within each of the sections in Part I mentioned above the transactions are grouped into sectors, such as 'Tax Revenue', 'Non-Tax Revenue' etc., for the receipt heads (revenue account), and 'General Services', 'Social and Community Services', 'Economic Services', etc., for expenditure heads. Specific functions or services (such as education, medical aid, family planning, houisng etc., in respect of Social and Community Services) are grouped in the sectors for expenditure heads. In Part III also the transactions are grouped into sectors, such as 'Small Savings' Provident Funds, etc., and 'Reserve Funds' etc. The sectors are subdivided into major heads of account. In some cases the sectors are, in addition, subdivided into sub-sectors before their division into major heads of account.

The major heads are divided into minor heads, each of which has a number of subordinate heads, generally known as sub-heads. The subheads are further divided into detailed heads. Under each of these heads, the expenditure is shown distributed between charged and voted. Sometimes major heads are also divided into sub-major heads before their further division into minor heads. The sectors, major heads, minor heads, sub-heads and detailed heads together constitute a five-tier arrangement of the classification structure of Government Accounts. The major, minor and sub-heads prescribed for the classification of expenditure in the general accounts are not necessarily identical with the Grants, Sub-heads and other units of allotments which are adopted by the Finance Department for Demands for Grants; but in general a certain degree of correlation is maintained between the Demands for Grants and the Finance Accounts.

The major heads of accounts, falling within the sectors for expenditure heads, generally correspond to functions of Government, while the minor heads, subordinate to them, identify the programmes undertaken to achieve the objectives of the function represented by the major head. The schemes or activities included in the programme generally correspond to sub-heads below a minor head representing a programme. Detailed heads give the object classification.

4. Codification

The sectors are distinguished by Capital letters of the alphabet in separate series for (i) resceipt major heads (revenue) account), (ii) expenditure major heads (revenue account) and (iii) capital section, public debt.; loans and advances and public account. The sub-sectors are distinguished by small letters of the alphabet.

Each major head is allotted a code number which consists of a three digit Arabic number code. The first digit indicates whether a particular major head pertains to the 'Revenue Receipt' section/'Revenue Expenditure' section / 'Capital Receipt' section / 'Capital Expenditure' section / 'Public Debt and Loans and advances, etc'., section or to the 'Public Account'. The next two digits indicate the major heads. The digits indicating the major heads remain the same for the major head denoting the same function occurring in the several sections included in the Consolidated Fund.

Under this scheme of codification, the receipt major heads-(revenue account) are assigned a block of consecutive serial numbers from 020 to 199, expenditure major heads (revenue account) from 211 ro 399, expenditure major heads (capital account) from 411 to 599, major heads under 'Public Debt' from 601 to 610, and those under 'Loans and Advances', 'Inter-State Settlement' and 'Transfer to Contingency Fund' from 611 to 799. The code number 400 has been assigned for Capital receipt major head. The only major head 'Contingency Fund' in Part

II—Contingency Fund" has been assigned the code number 800. The major heads in the Public Account are assigned the code numbers from 801 to 899.

5. The transactions included in these accounts represent mainly the actual cash receipts and disbursements during the financial year April to March as distinguished from amounts due to or from Government during the same period. The cash basis system is, however, not entirely suitable for recording the transactions and presenting the true state of affairs of Government commercial undertakings run on commercial principles. The detailed accounts of this class of undertakings are, therefore, maintained outside the regular accounts in proper commercial form and are subjected to test check by the Indian Audit and Accounts Department.

6. The figures of actuals shown in the accounts are met, after taking into account the recoveries, although the Demands presented to the Legislature and the Appropriation Accounts are for gross expenditure and exclude all credits and recoveries which are otherwise taken as reduction of expenditure.

7. The progressive figures carried forward under different heads of account upto 31st March 1974 are to be shown against new heads of account effective from 1st April 1974. In many cases the progressive figure at the end of 1973-74 under an existing minor head is to be distributed under several new minor heads within a new major head, or, in some cases, even more than one major head. In several cases the schemewise identification and consequently functional reclassification of the expenditure already booked is not possible. As such, allocation of the progressive figures to new heads of account is not feasible with reference to records maintained in the Accounts Offices and necessary information has to be collected from the departmental offices. As progressive figures of capital expenditure at the end of a year have been carried forward over many years past, collection of information necessary for distribution of such figures among the new heads of account effective from 1st April 1974 is further rendered difficult on account of many factors like reorganisation of departmental offices, reorganisation of Audit and Accounts Offices and even reorganisation of States and integration of the former princely States. Attempt has been made to distribute such figures on the basis of details/information obtained from the records available with the Indian Audit and Accounts Department or from Government Departments . The progressive figures upto 31st March 1974 which could not be distributed have been shown either under a separate minor head 'Pre-1974-75 Outlay not allocated' or jointly against more than one minor head.

Explanatory Notes

1. Capital Outlay on Industrial and Economic Development—The details of the Government investments in (i) statutory corporations (ii) Government companies, (iii) Joint stock companies and (iv) Co-operative institutions are given in statement No. 14.

Sixteen companies in which the Government had invested Rs. 28.82 lakhs are under liquidation. Thirteen other companies in which the Government had invested Rs. 23.68 lakhs have been liquidated upto 1974-75. Some co-operative societies are under liquidation ; complete information about the realisation or the write off of Government investment in these companies/ societies is awaited (December 1975).

In 1974-75 the Government invested Rs. 4,44 64 lakhs in shares of Government companies (Rs. 3,00 70 lakhs) and Co-operative institutions (Rs. 1,43 94 lakhs). In addition Rs. 61 70 lakhs were invested in debentures of Orissa State Co-operative Land Development Bank.

The amount of Rs. 58.00 lakhs drawn during 1973-74 for investment in shares of "Orissa Tyres Ltd." has been refunded during 1974-75.

According to the information furnished by the Government the total investment of the Government in the share capital and debentures of different concerns at the end of 1972-73, 1973-74 and 1974-75 were Rs. 50⁻¹⁰ crores, Rs. 54⁻³⁹ crores and Rs. 58⁻²⁶ crores respectively. The dividend and interest received therefrom was Rs. 10⁻⁰⁶ lakhs (0⁻²⁰ per cent) Rs.11⁻¹⁷ lakhs (0⁻²⁰ per cent) and Rs. 23⁻⁶¹ lakhs (0⁻⁴⁰ per cent) respectively. Further details are given in Appendix—I.

2. Capital Outlay on Multipurpose River Schemes—Of the multipurpose river schemes, the Hirakud Dam Project⁶ (Stage I and II) has been completed. The capital invested thereon upto 1974-75 (excluding indirect charges) was Rs. 69.22 crores. The loss on its working during the year was Rs. 1.19 crores after providing the interest charges (Rs. 1.22 crores) on the capital outlay. The detailed accounts showing the financial results of these projects and other irrigation works is given in statement No. 3 (i).

3. Capital Outlay on Electricity Schemes—With the formation of the State Electricity Board from the 1st March 1961, all completed transmission and distribution systems and generation assets of the Hirakud systems and the Talcher Thermal Scheme have been transferred to the State Electricity Board. The allocation of capital outlay between the Orissa State Electricity Board and the Government has not been finalised. Capital expenditure of Rs. 65'50 crores was transferred to the Board in 1964-65 (Rs. 16'72 crores), 1966-67 (Rs. 0'72 crore), 1969-70 (Rs. 17'24 crores) and 1970-71 (Rs. 30'81 crores) and has been treated as loan.

1. Financial results of the minor irrigation schemes have not been shown in this statement.

2. The net loss expressed as a percentage of the capital outlay to end of 1974-75 is 5*24. The irrigation projects which have been declared as commercial undertakings are mentioned at pages 28-29 and twenty-one other multipurpose major and medinm irrigation projects are under execution.

3. Collection of water rates:—According to rules framed by the Government in November 1961 for the assessment and the realisation of the water rates, these rates are being assessed and collected by the Revenue authorities, the gross collection being accounted for under major head "029—Land Revenue". The question of prescribing a procedure for transferring the net collection to the irrigation major heads and allocation of the revenue collected to individual schemes opened to service was taken up with the Government in 1968. The final decision of the Government is awaited.

4. Non-assessment of betterment levy and water charges:-Betterment charges have not been levied on lands irrigated by the canals of the irrigation schemes.

5. Productive and un-productive works:—The works in the Irrigation Department are classified as "Productive and Unproductive" according as the net revenue (Gross revenue less working expenses) derived from each work on the expiry of 10 years from the closure of construction estimate covers or does not cover the prescribed annual interest charges on the capital invested.

The productivity test involves certain *proforma* adjustments which do not appear in the regular Government accounts. If a work classed as produc tive fails to yield the prescribed return for three successive years it is classed as 'Unproductive'. Similarly, if a work classified as 'Unproductive' yields for three successive years the prescribed return it is transferred to 'Productive' class. The prescribed rate is 4 per cent on power and 3 per cent on Irrigation for Hirakud Dam Project State-I, 4 per cent for Orissa Canal Project and Rushikulya System, 4.5 per cent for Salandi Irrigation Project and Medium Irrigation Projects and 3.75 per cent for Delta Irrigation Scheme.

The Hirakud Dam Project Statge-I and II have been classified as 'Productive' from 1966-67. The other Major and Medium Irrigation Schemes have been classed as 'Unproductive'.

3 (ii) FINANCIAL RESULTS OF ELECTRICITY SCHEMES

1. Machkund Hydro-Electric (Joint) Scheme:—The Government had undertaken the Machkund Hydro-Electric (Joint) Scheme in 1944 jointly with the Government of Andhra Pradesh with equal rights. Subsequently, it was decided that the Government of Orissa should transfer 20 per cent of its rights to the Government of Andhra Pradesh for 99 years in lieu of which the latter should pay compensation to the former according to the terms and conditions agreed upon between the two Governments. During the construction period Orissa and Andhra were to bear 30 per cent and 70 per cent respectively of the capital expenditure. The capital invested by the Government of Orissa to end of 1958-59 was Rs. 462:64 lakhs. The debits raised by the Government of Andhra Pradesh for Rs. 66:19 lakhs representing Orissa share (30 per cent) of the Capital expenditure during 1959-60 to 1974-75 have not been accepted by the Government of Orissa.

With the formation of the Orissa State Electricity Board from March 1961 all the completed transmission and distribution systems and generating assets of Hirakud system and Talcher Thermal Scheme have been transferred to the Board. The Government have retained under it the Machkund Hydro-Electric (Joint) Scheme.

The actual receipts from sale of power and miscellaneous revenue of Machkund Hydro-Electric (Joint) Scheme were Rs. 79'38 lakhs in 1974-75 against working expenses of Rs. 4'57 lakhs (exclusive of interest charges of Rs. 17'60 lakhs on capital provided by the Government and debit on account of maintenance charges not received from the Government of Andhra Pradesh). The gross receipts from the Scheme and the working expenses exclusive of interst on capital to end of 1974-75 were Rs. 8,76'59 lakhs and Rs. 4,08'24 lakhs respectively.

2. Balimela Dam and Power Project:—The Balimela Dam Project was taken up by the Government in 1961-62 jointly with the Government of Andhra Pradesh at an estimated cost of Rs. 24 crores. While the expenditure on the Dam was to be shared equally by the two Governments, fifty per cent of water of the reservoir was to be utilised by the power project (estimated cost Rs. 21'39 crores) in the Orissa side. Since the entire Project is in execution by the Government of Orissa the expenditure in excess of the original estimate in respect of Balimela Dam Project is being borne in full by Government, pending final agreement with the Government of Andhra Pradesh. The total expenditure on the project at the end of 1974-75 was Rs. 67'93 crores (Balimela Dam Rs. 34'37 crores and Balimela Power Project Rs. 33'56 crores).

Four out of six units of power projects were commissioned up to 31st March 1975. Actual receipts on sale of power (to Orissa State Electricity Board) were Rs. 315.68 lakhs in 1974-75 against working expense of Rs. 15.55 lakhs and interest charges of Rs. 363.06 lakhs on capital provided by the Government.

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STATEMENT No. 4-DEBT POSITION

No law under Article 293 of the Constitution has been passed by the Legislature of the State laying down the limit within which Government may borrow on the security of the Consolidated Fund of the State.

Further details of debt and other interest bearing obligations are given in Statement No. 17.

(i) Statement of borrowings

Explanatory Notes

(1) Total debt:—The total indebtedness of the State Government increased by Rs. 46.98 crores during 1974-75 to Rs. 7,00.24 crores.

The repayment of debt during the year was Rs. 29.32 crores.

(2) Internal Debt of the State Government :—This includes market loans bearing interest, market loans not bearing interest, loans from the Life Insurance Corporation of India, loans from the National Agricultural Credit Fund of the Reserve Bank of India and loans from other institutions and banks.

Out of Rs. 33.20 crores of loans received by the State Government, Rs. 14.33 crores (Rs. 13.79 crores realised in cash, Rs. 0.39 crore by conversion of $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent Orissa Government Loan, 1974 and the remaining amount of Rs. 0.15 crore representing 1 per cent discount loan credited to Market Loan by debit to Interest payment were raised from the open market during 1974-75. This bears interest at 6 per cent and is repayable at par in 1984. In additon, Rs. 0.04 crore received on account of Orissa Government Loans raised during 1974-75 and earlier years lying under "848—Civil Deposits", were adjusted against the open market loan 1980 and 1981 during 1974-75 on issue of scrips. The balance amount of Rs. 18.83 crores was received from the banks and institutions. Repayment of Rs. 16.18 crores represents discharges of expired open market loans to the extent tendered for discharge (Rs. 7.29 crores) and repayment of loans received from other banks and institutions (Rs. 8.89 crores).

Full particulars of outstanding loans of Rs. 1,22'29 crores under the head will be found in Statement Nos. 17 and 17-A.

Arrangement for amortisation:—In accordance with the notification for the open market loans raised by the Government the following provision for amortisation of each loan are to be made annually begining with the financial year immediately following that in which the loan was raised.

(a) Depreciation Fund:—A sum equal to $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the toal nominal amount of loans raised upto 1970-71 is set apart annually to form a depreciation fund for purchasing the securities of the loans for cancellation. No such provision has been made in respect of the loans raised thereafter. The amount of Rs. 70.14 lakhs shown as addition to the fund in the table at page 34 represents amount appropriated from revenue for market loan raised upto 1970-71. (b) Sinking Fund:—In addition to the annual contribution to the respective depreciation funds, an annual contribution is made to the sinking fund for amortisation of loans, at such rates as the Government may decide from time to time.

Rupees 13,76.29 lakhs out of the total balance of the Funds have been invested in securities. Of that, Rs. 4,52.31 lakhs have been invested in securities of the Government of India, Rs. 5,64.78 lakhs in securities of other States and Rs. 3,59.20 lakhs in debentures and bonds of Orissa Cooperative Land Development Bank, Electricity Boards of Orissa and other States and Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation.

The amortisation arrangements have been dispensed with from 1974-75 by the Government. However, Rs. 7.24 lakhs have been appropriated to the Sinking Fund for amortisation of loans received from the Life Insurance Corporation of India.

The withdrawal of Rs. 8,09.44 lakhs from the funds during the year represents amount transferred from Sinking fund of Orissa for Orissa Government Loan 1974 to "880—Miscellaneous Government Account" on maturity of loan.

The annexure to Statement No. 19 shows further particulars of depreciation funds, contributions from the State revenues to Sinking Fund and investments out of accumulations in Sinking Fund of the respective loans.

(c) Ways and Means advances:—Ways and Means Advances of Rs. 5.40 crores were availed of by the Government from the Reserve Bank of India during 1974-75. Rs. 0.02 crore were repaid in March 1975 leaving a balance of Rs. 5.38 crores.

(a) Difference of Rs. 65'56 lakhs is due to inclusion of interest earned during 1973-74.

(d) The balance of Rs. 400 crores on the 1st April 1974 relating to cash credit accommodation from the State Bank of India was repaid and a fresh cash credit accommodation to the extent of Rs. 800 crores was availed of by the Government in March 1975 from the State Bank of India. No repayment was made during the year. Interest of Rs. 426 lakhs was paid on this account during the year.

(e) The details of loans received from other Institutions will be found in Statement No. 17.

(3) Loans and advances from the Central Government :—(a) A statement of loans taken by the State Government is given in Statement n_0 . 17.

(b) The Government have made the following amortisation arrangement for the repayment of loans taken from the Government of India as its share out of market borrowing in 1963 (in lieu of open market loan 1975) and for industrial housing scheme.

(i) Share out of open market borrowings in 1963 :-- A contribution is made to the sinking fund for amortisation of loan (repayable in 1975) at such rate as the Government may decide from time to time. No contributions were made from revenue to the sinking fund during 1974-75. The balance in the fund at the end of 1974-75 was Rs. 5,80.71 lakhs.

(ii) Industrial Housing Scheme :- An amount equivalent to the actual recoveries made from the industrialists is transferred to a sinking fund. The balance in the fund at the end of 1974-75 was Rs. 17.79 lakhs. Of that Rs. 9.70 lakhs were invested in the securities of the Government of India.

(iii) Rehabilitation loans and National Loans Scholarship Scheme :--According to the revised terms decided by the Government of India in December, 1974 for repayment of loans for rehabilitation of "Displaced persons from erstwhile East Pakistan", "Repatriates from Burma", and "Rehabilitation of Goldsmiths" and repayment of loans under "National Loans Scholarship Scheme", the State Government is to repay to the Government of India one half of the principal of the loan recovered from the beneficiaries of the loan and retain the other half together with full interest thereon. The State's share representing one-half of the principal is to be treated as grant from the Government of India. The total recovery of loans amounting to Rs. 1.97 lakhs made during 1974-75 (Burma Repatriates; Rs. 1.00 lakh, Displaced Gold Smiths: Rs. 0.05 lakh and National loan Scholarship: Rs. 0.92 lakh) will be adjusted according to the revised terms and conditions in 1975-76.

Details of loans availed for different schemes by the State Government during 1974-75 are given in statement no. 17-A.

(4) Small Savings and Provident Funds, etc.—This comprises the Provident Fund balances of the Government servants.

(ii) Other obligations

In addition to the borrowings mentioned above the balances at the credit of the earmarked and other funds as also certain deposits to the extent in which they have not been invested but are merged with general balance of the Government also constitute the liability of the State Government. The amount of this liability at the end of 1974-75 was Rs. 68.44 crores as shown below; further details are given in statement nos. 16 and 19.

No law under Article 293 of the Constitution has been passed by the State Legislature laying down the limits within which the Government may give guarantees on the security of the Consolidated Fund of the State.

The Government guaranteed the payment of loans, etc., raised by various institutions and in consideration thereof they were to pay to the Government guarantee commission at rates varying from 0.01 per cent to 1 per cent of the outstanding guarantee. Some institutions defaulted in payment of the guarantee commission. The extent of such default, according to information furnished by the departmental officers, has been mentioned in column 4 of the detailed statement below. It will be seen that Rs. 1,05.25 lakhs were outstanding from these bodies towards guarantee commission.

The Government paid Rs. 2.54 lakhs during 1974-75 in discharge of guarantee obligations for one Government company, two industrial cooperative societies and one individual. Government have initiated action to recover the amount through proposals of liquidation and leasing out the units.

Explanatory Notes

Under an agreement with the Reserve Bank of India the State Government has to maintain with the Reserve Bank a minimum balance of Rs. 30 lakhs on all working days from the 1st March 1967. The Bank informs the Government of its daily balance with the Bank at the close of each working day. If the balance falls below the agreed minimum on any day the deficiency is made good either by taking a ways and means advance from the Reserve Bank or by selling treasury bills.

The ways and means advances are granted by the Bank only up to a limit mutually agreed upon between the Bank and the Government. During 1974-75 the limits were Rs. 3.60 crores for normal and Rs. 4.40 crores for special ways and means advances. The rate of interest on both the advances is charged at one per cent below the bank rate; during 1974-75 it was eight per cent.

⁽a) There is a difference of Rs. 167 lokhs between the figures reflected in the account ond these recived from the Reserve Bank of India (Rs 5,85.04 lakhs). The difference is under reconciliation.

Out of the ways and means advances of Rs. 5'40 crores (Rs. 3'60 crores normal ways and means advance obtained on four occassion and Rs. 1'80 crores special ways and means advance obtained on three occassions) obtained from the Reserve Bank during 1974-75, Rs. 0'02 crore were repaid during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 5'38 crores at the end of the year which was repaid in 1975-76. No interest was paid for the advances during 1974-75.

If even after the maximum advance is given, the cash balance is below the minimum, the deficiency is left uncovered but the Bank charges interest at the bank rate on such overdrafts ; during 1974-75 it was nine per cent. Overdrafts of Rs. 3'37 crores over and above the deficiency of Rs. 0'30 crore was also availed of on four occassions during the year. The amount was fully repaid on the 31st March 1975. The Government paid during 1975-76 Rs. 0'20 lakh as interest on the overdraft for the year 1974-75.

The Treasury Bills of Rs. 1,24'21 crores were also rediscounted on various dates during 1974-75 to make up the deficiency in the cash balance. The minimum balance with the Reserve Bank of India was maintained by the State Government during 1974-75 for 356 days without obtaining advances, for 5 days by taking normal and special ways and means advances and for 4 days by taking overdraft.

2. The cash balance with the Reserve Bank (minus Rs. 5,86'71 lakhs) as shown in Government account represents the balance after taking into account inter-Governmental monetary settlements pertaining to 1974-75 advised to the Reserve Bank up to the 25th April 1975.

Explanatory Notes

The significance of the term "Government Account" is explained in note 3 below. The other headings in the summary take into account the balance in the Government books where the Government has a liability to repay the moneys received or has a claim to recover the amount paid and also heads of account opened in the books for adjustment of remittance transactions. It must be understood that these balances can not be regarded as complete record of the financial position of the Government of Orissa as these do not take into account the physical assets of the State such as lands, buildings, communications, etc. or any accrued dues or outstanding liabilities which are not brought to account under the cash basis of accounting followed by the Government.

2. A summary of receipts, disbursements and balances under debt, Contingency Fund and Public Account is given in statement no. 16.

In a number of cases there are unreconciled differences in the closing balance as reported in statement no. 16 and that shown in the separate registers or other records maintained in the Accounts Office/ departmental offices for the purpose. Steps are bing taken to settle the discrepancies as soon as possible. In many cases the full details and documents required for the purpose are awaited from the department/Treasury officers; some cases are detailed in Appendix-II.

The balances are communicated to the departmental officers every year for acceptance thereof. In a large number of cases such acceptances have not been received.

The following are instance where verification and acceptances of balances of large amounts have been delayed. In many cases the delay extends over several years :---

3. Government Account :--Under the system of book-keeping followed in Government accounts, the amount booked under revenue, Capital and other transactions of Government, the balances of which are not carried forward from year to year are closed to a single head called "Government Account". The balance under the head represents the cumulative result of all such transactions so that after adding thereto balances under Public Debt, Loans and Advances, Small Savings, Provident Funds, etc., Reserve Funds, Deposits and advances, suspense and miscellaneous (Other than Miscellaneous Government account), Remittances and the Contingency Fund, the closing cash balance at the end of the year may be worked out and proved.
