JD reconciliation attempt fails

EFFORTS for reconciliation between the feuding factions in the Janata Dal appear to have failed to take off with the breakaway group deciding to go ahead with their plans to give shape to their party.

On a day of hectic activities, the Janata Dal president, Mr S. R. Bommai, today deputed the Karnataka unit chief, Mr Deve Gowda, to talk to the rebels as another senior leader from the state, Mr Ramakrishna Hegde, did not find fault with the dissidents for the split and said "if reservations and mutual suspicions". were not cleared then it could not lead to "logical consequence".

Janata Dal leaders of Karnataka and the Orissa chief minister, Mr Biju Patnaik, are reported to have expressed their willingness to back the breakaway Janata Dal MPs in their bid to capture the party but the move is being frustrated by the stiff resistance of Mr Rabi Ray, a prominent member of the rebel group.

Gowda and Mr.R.K.Hegde,today mounted pressure on the adamant Mr Ray to adopt a more conciliatory stand towards his bete noire, Mr Patnaik. These efforts were continuing till late tonight

tomorrow morning. It is doubtful whether these efforts will eventually succeed for Mr Ray and Mr.Patnaik have never seen eye to

Mr Patnaik was scheduled to arrive here today but was believed to have put off his departure from Bhuvaneshwar till this issue is resolved here.

All the members of the breakaway group, who had gone out to canvass support in the various states, have now returned to the capital and a lengthy meeting was held at Mr. Yunnus Saleem's resi-

The rebels appear to have admitted defeat regarding their original plans to dislodge the Bihar chief minister, Mr Laloo Prasad Yadav. Striking a different stance today, they said, they were not in the numbers game and their effort is now to form the government after the assembly elections are held. They admitted that they would necessarily have to seek the support of the Congress and the BJP to topple the chief minister, which would prove suicidal for them in the long run. Besides, this would only help Mr.Laloo Prasad Yaday consolidate his position as he would emerge a martyr.

THE campaign against corruption in Maharashtra has taken a new twist with the former municipal commissioner, Mr S.S.Tinaikar, asking the BRCC chief, Mr Murli Deora, to "share responsibility in equal measure' with Mr Sharad Pawar for "looters working in tandem with ministers," and Mr Deora himself hinting that he was not happy with the functioning of the housing ministry headed by Mr Chhagan Bhujbal.

Although Mr Deora did not name Mr Bhujbal directly, he said he had received several complaints from private trusts that the housing ministry was not allocating plots of land reserved for schools and colleges. "I have been shouting about this at meetings with the government, but the government has failed miserably in correcting the situation," he said.


