



Introduction Of Hindi As Official Language

BOMBAY GOVERNMENT'S BILL

THE Government of Bombay has taken steps for the appropriation of statutory powers for the progressive introduction of Hindi as the official language above district level.

The Government has published a Bill in the official Gazette for the declaration of the official languages of
